How we got started

The academy was founded by Heaven Spencer alongside a group of fellow therapists when Covid-19 initially started affecting schools' abilities to serve students. Schools were closed to encourage social distancing and for many virtual learning replaced classroom instruction, causing much stress and difficulty for many students and their families. Kids with autism were at an even greater disadvantage often struggling to remain seated and stay focused with no one in person to reinforce and keep them motivated.

Aware that the children they worked with had needs that were not being met, the group went to work teaming up with Pastor Craig Bridgers at The Crossings Church to create an alternative learning environment for the students to thrive and complete their assigned schoolwork. In August of 2020 Open Seas Learning Academy began to successfully serve the needs of the kids and their families.

A full-service special education team


